CYBER STORM III WANTS YOU

The Sacramento Office of Emergency Services, in partnership with the California Emergency Management Agency (Cal. EMA) and the Center for Infrastructure Assurance and Security (CIAS) is hosting the third in a series of community-wide table-top exercises leading up to Cyber Storm III. CS3 is a national exercise to determine how

well communities respond to cyber-security attack. Community Exercise #3 will examine the community's relationship to the state in cyber events and will focus on information sharing and analysis across state and local organizational boundaries.

We need representatives from two sectors: (1) state agencies; and (2) local/

community agencies. Representatives should be managers who can make decisions, or recommend actions, in response to a cyber-security attack.
